Introduction

The purpose of this charter is to clearly communicate the **reason** for our existence and the **meaning** behind all of our activity. This articulation will help us understand and live our purpose, respond confidently to our critics, and keep us accountable for our behavior.

History

Sequoia Church has a rich 80-year history in Redwood City. We began with a newspaper advertisement in 1940 seeking like-minded Christians to establish a new church completely independent of any denomination or affiliation. First Christian Church was born, and was led by a variety of pastors and leaders for the next several decades. In the 1960's we purchased our current property on Topaz St. with an eye to Alameda de las Pulgas, a main thoroughfare through the city. In 1999 we changed our name to Sequoia Christian Church and began making changes to style and expression relevant to emerging generations. In 2004 we merged with a local startup church (Shorelife) bringing together two congregations and renewed leadership.

Throughout Sequoia's history, members and leaders have taken courageous steps of faith and served in humility to advance a strong, healthy, and effective presence for the Gospel of Jesus in our community. Now in 2020, we are listening once again to the move of God's Spirit guiding and leading us to a new and renewed expression of our church. We invite you to join us as we together **Follow Jesus**.



Our Mission

There is a simplicity to Sequoia. We have no denominational affiliation, nor are we beholden to heritage (though we honor it). We care deeply about being our authentic selves. We are learning to be “comfortable with being uncomfortable,” as Jesus leads us to the unknown, the uncertain, the unforeseen, and the unexpected. We truly embrace the wonderful mystery that comes with a faith that is often risky and frequently whimsical. Our hearts are open and willing to behave in new ways as the Spirit leads and guides. We are, in all of those senses, simply following Jesus, wherever he may lead us. And by having the courage to follow in faith, we are fulfilling the biblical definition of discipleship and the human experience of faith. All this is summed up in our mission,

Sequoia Church exists to **Follow Jesus.**

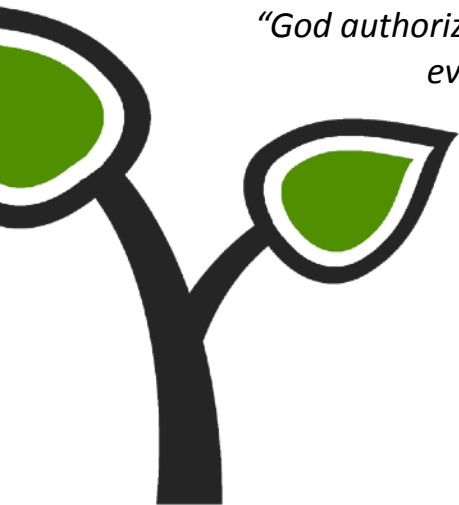

A **challenging** place to **grow**.

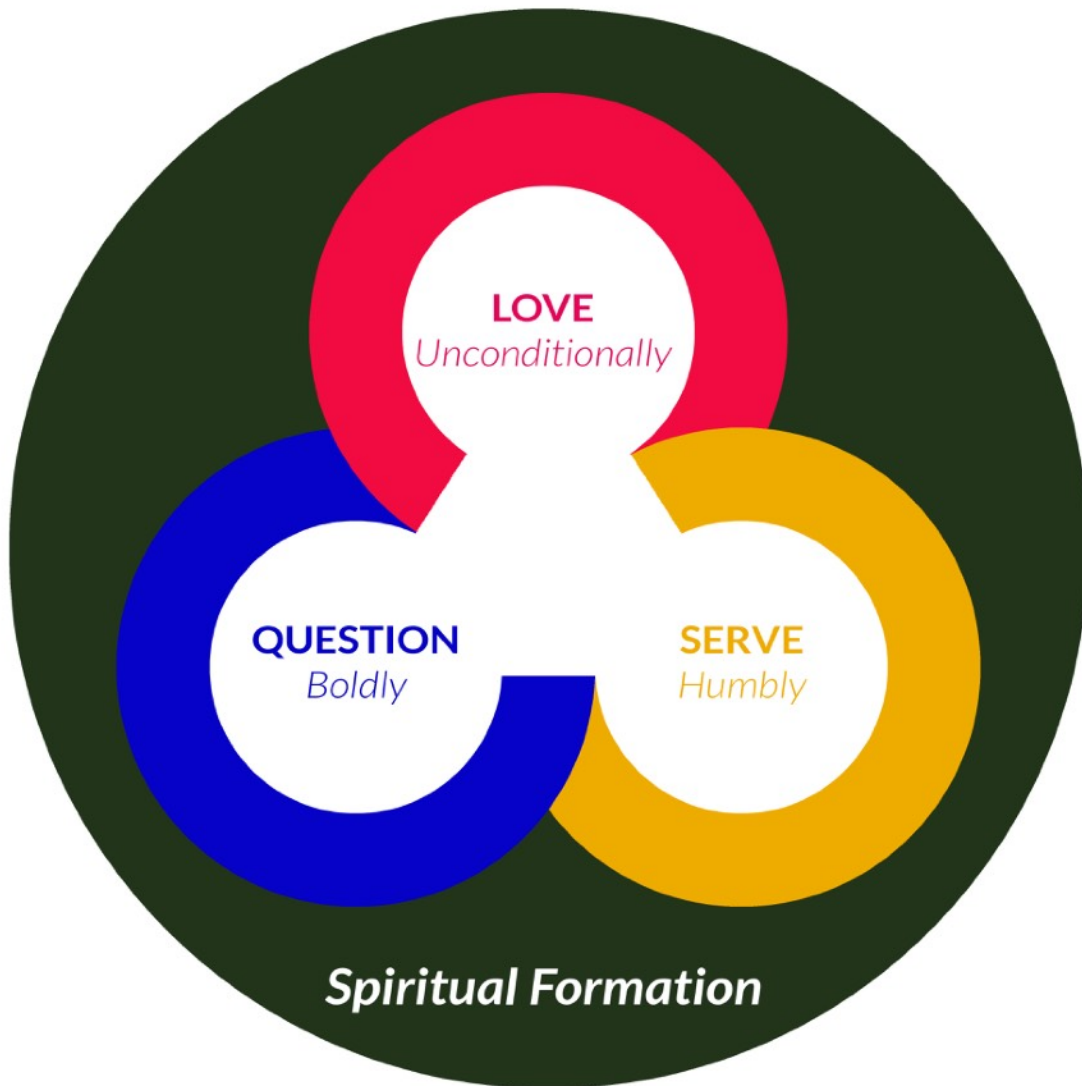

We also believe that faith is not blind but rather wide-eyed, and open to the entirety of the world. We frequently doubt, question, misunderstand, and want to dig deeper. Through this kind of curiosity, we grow, we mature, we discover, and we wrestle with God.
